

Epilogue

Since the original publication of Muckross, Brexit has come to pass, and Harvard University has published their report on racism that includes their atonement for their part in collaboration with what they acknowledged, caused a wrong. In the meantime, the source of that cause remains elsewhere and is not in America.

The Academié Gaeilge has not yet been formed and until that happens, linguistic chaos reigns, likewise human rights especially for Black people, because their stories remain suppressed and denied a rightful forum, especially in America. The Irish Government need to honor the sovereign legacy and be seen to act honorably, and do their deed, if only if, they are to remain a lasting sovereign state and a bearer among all the nations of the world.

In the meantime, the sun doesn't stop to pause, and more changes are happening, and social challenges arriving to the shores to take the opportunities presented. Unlike before, the Puffin may not be the instigator this time for the next spoken language on The Isles, however the proximity of Africa is closer than ever before, and Arabic makes a good bedfellow. Whose stories will there be left to remember?
