We are all animals of the Earth and we co-exist in our own ways .Primitive man when hunting knew how 'to listen', to feed the tribe, and their silent body language played the strategy to capture their prey. The monkey is the progenitor of the first word 'hooker' and as in 'hooker boat' found off the west coast of Ireland .This ancient boat has sails .This chapter may be the only explanation ever given to date how man learned his words from a monkey and then applied them.

Science has proven that Monkeys on the west coast of Africa give out a sound that resonates with 'hooker' and can be spelt in various ways and all sounding similar depending on dialects.
