I hope God did.

Where is God? That's a good question.

I know when my son was a young boy we used to look for Wally, a comic character. He was on every page but we still had to find him, and we did. Finding Wally was a game. So, 'Wally is on every page'.

When I was young Denis the Menace was the person at large then. He had cousins and friends such as Desperate Dan and Beryl The Peril. They absorbed my energy in my youth and gave me lots of ideas. When my son has his own children who will Wally's next of kin be and where? My guess is he will be in the clouds and not on the pages. So complicated everything becomes. Soon Wally's son will only be in the clouds and not on the pages. Oh technology changes everything. So does language.

Wally was English. I have never known an Irish Wally. As usual everything I am informed about arrives from the east coast through media. That includes Dublin, London and the EU. This forms all the channels of our bureaucracy as we know it today in Ireland. Why not from the west coast of Ireland?

As a result of bureaucratization in our daily lives nobody has the time to think what is good for themselves and as a result life passes and time changes. The Irish/ Gaelic language under the stewardship of The State changes too because that is what languages do. Unknown to most of us the control of its true original origins in Ireland lies with people that have lived elsewhere other than Ireland and never with a native west of Ireland qualified Professor of Ancient Irish. Why are they not holding this esteemed office where it really matters? Are they the victims of 'total bureaucratization' and stunted to behave as the 'perfect student' for an entire lifetime? Does the experience of operating within a system of formalized rules and regulations, under hierarchies of impersonal officials, hold a kind of covert appeal? There is a school of thought that holds that bureaucracy tends to expand according to a kind of perverse but inescapable inner logic. The argument runs as follows: if you create a bureaucratic structure to deal with a problem, that structure will invariably end up creating other problems that seem as if they, too, can only be solved by bureaucratic means. In universities, this is sometimes informally referred to as the "creating committees to deal with the problem of too many committees" problem.

A slightly different version of the argument is that once bureaucracy has been created, it will immediately move to make itself indispensable to anyone trying to wield power, no matter what they wish to do with it. The chief way to do this is always by attempting to monopolize access to the certain key types of information. As Max Weber, one of the greatest German scholars of the later 19th and early 20th centuries, writes: 'Every bureaucracy seeks to increase the superiority of the professionally informed by keeping their knowledge and intentions secret ...in so far as it can, it hides its knowledge and actions

from criticism . Once created it is hard to get rid of it .The only real way to rid oneself of an established bureaucracy according to Weber , is to simply kill them all , as Alaric the Goth did in Imperial Rome , or Genghis Khan in certain parts of the middle east . Leaving any significant numbers of functionaries alive and, within a few years they will inevitably end up managing one's kingdom.

In the upper echelons of the Irish public sector and most 'respectable people ' , believe that unless any language found to originate from the west coast including Kerry needs to have a correlation with Indo European languages first and always first with no exceptions and this is their conventional wisdom . Even if the discovery originated to belong to a much earlier period predating the Indo-European family of languages .This does not make sensible logic .This is like comparing chalk and cheese and expect them both on the menu.

When bureaucracy ideas become a conventional wisdom, it is extremely difficult to change it, because many so-called 'serious people' have lined up behind it.

As the wonderful economist JK Galbraith noted, when "serious people" are faced with the choice between changing their minds and finding the proof that there is no need to do so, they invariably get busy looking for the proof'.

As a result, there is no debate, and those who suggest that the emperor has no clothes are dismissed as mavericks or cranks – or, worse still, they are accused, in the ultimate putdown deployed by serious people, of guess what? Not being serious.
But this is deadly serious .Because there is no way we can foster our real language and real culture where it truly matters and claim it to be ours .Or better still to make it ours .

So, who benefits? Clearly those people who are well paid in very senior civil servant positions entrenched in secured gold minted positions and they do not want their conventional wisdom to change even when it should.

The Rising of 1916 is a celebration of freedom in Ireland and the General Post Office in Dublin was the center of this location and also the center of gravity where all national bureaucracy is networked from what was originally modelled from Germany and its Deutsch Post system. It could be argued that the insurrection might have been an attack on bureaucracy that had its origins in Germany under a peaceful social order. Partition resulted and the dissidents known as republicans became divided and all in the name of bureaucracy and how it should be run.

There was a time in the middle ages when Kerry became divided too between north and south and the dividing line was the river Maine in the center of the county .Even religion was not part of the reason because this was during a period before the reign of Henry VIII. It had its origins in the House of Plantagenet in the north of England and under the local tutelage of King John in Lymericke Citi. It would be interesting to see the notes of the local functionaries 'The Barney Cops' who imposed the new bureaucracy in the name of feudalism and religious Norman bureaucracy and those names they held. These bureaucrats were known as Normans who mainly hailed from below the Hadrian Wall in north of England and who carried the loyalty of their own fiefdom to North Kerry.

The said evidence of the substrate Gaelic language came from the west, and this forms the origins of what made Kerry in the first place and where it goes from here on after.

Bureaucracy must not be allowed to stunt a regional opportunity for the people that now live there.

Since the creation of the new Irish Taxi Regulatory Authority, it has been noticed that Irish taxis must show a designated emblem properly inserted by authorized personnel on the

vehicle and that the words shown to be either 'Taxi' or 'Tacsai' . So, for the first time there are two separate words for taxi as we once knew it. An e-mail to An Forus Gaeilge to request the meaning of this word 'Tacsai' was sent, and this was their written response:

"The word tacsai has been used in Irish since at least 1959, when it was included in De Bhaldraithe's English Irish dictionary. It was likely a direct translation of the English word, which it seems was based on the Latin taxare' 'to levy a fee'. The word would not be used in Irish as it is an English word and there is no reason to use an English word when speaking or writing in Irish unless it is trademarked and cannot be translated" .

Their logic is confusing. Especially when they imply that they have never known a previous Irish word for taxi and just because they claim it is an English word then the word is wrong to use. Maybe this has something to do with the 1916 GPO proclamation. A Latin word, so they say, seems an 'ok' acceptable fashion to adopt. It still makes nonsense .Just imagine foreigners never before in Ireland sees a sea of 'tacsai' and taxis, they cannot be blamed for thinking that they might be in Rome making a choice that is challenging the black economy and Irish credibility factor .

So, is the word Taxi an English word? The evidence presented in this compendium shows that the word Tax and Cáin are both Wolof and from Africa? Why is The State calling bluff? Taxi is a Gaelic word and more importantly a Kerry word .The world should know that. So is Irish dancing originally part of Kerry culture before anywhere else on the island of Ireland or Britain.
